| Far left | Ó | Used to scroll the document. |
|-----------|---|--------------------------------|
| Left side | Ò | Points at a line or paragraph. |
| Center | ð | Points at characters or words. |
| Far right | ÷ | Manipulates windows. |

Detail Apply \tilde{O}

MARK the \tilde{O} on the far right margin of the menu.

PROCEDURE MOVE the cursor all the way to the left of the screen. Move it so it is a do pointing both up and down like this: \acute{O} . This is the scroll arrow. If you have moved it points up and to the right, like this: \acute{O} , you need to go farther left.

The cursor changes to a triangular shape similar to a thumb nail like this: \ddot{O} .

The double-pointed arrow will point down like this: 1.

The double-pointed arrow will point up like this: \hat{O} .

PROCEDURE Move the cursor into the left region of the screen, so it points like this:
